

# Permission Menu

## Definition

The **Permission Menu** allows you to configure category permissions for user-defined groups in run-time.

This feature alleviates the need to go into the userview builder to manually adjust for every category.

Enable Refined Controls?

Allows administrators to implement intricate user permission configurations per group.

**Important Note**

Once this feature is enabled, only users with **administrative** access can manage the permission.

As opposed to Figure 2, when configuring permission, you will be brought to the following screen for finer permission control.

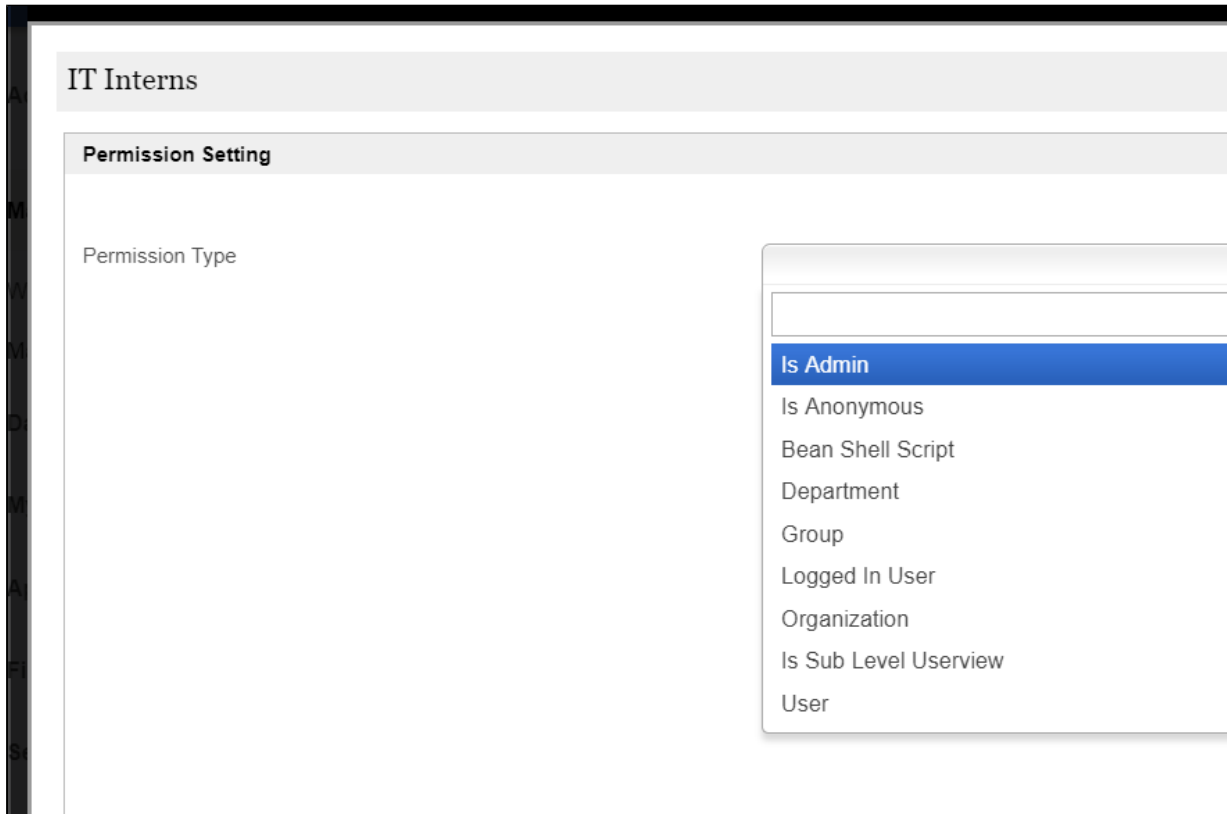


Figure 4: Enabled Refined Controls

**How to use this permission plugin in a userview category**

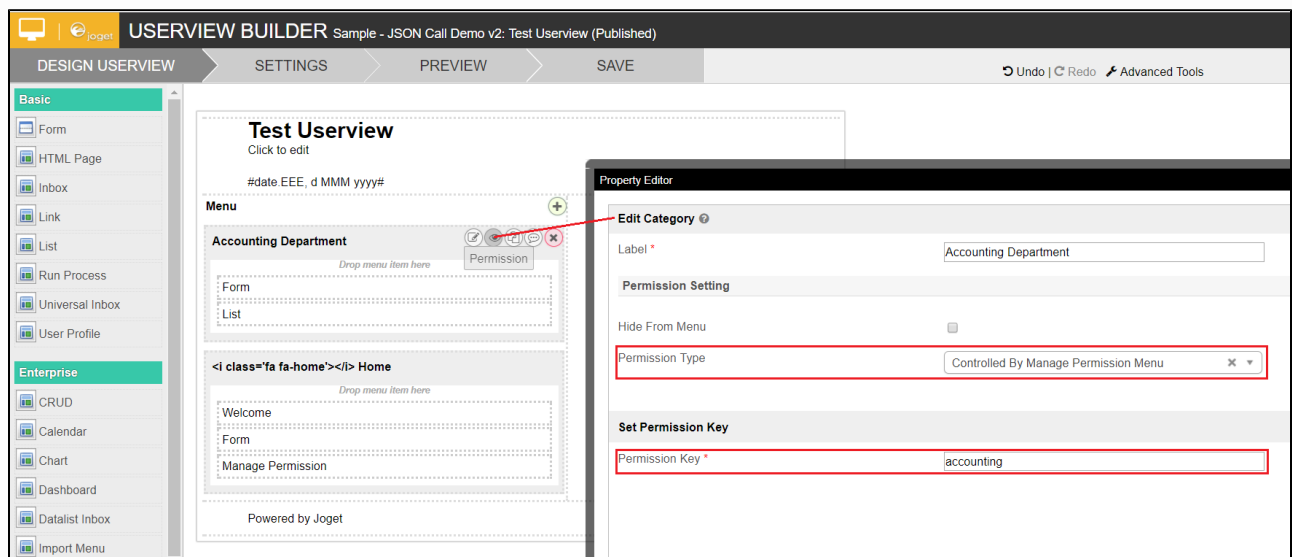


Figure 5: Adding permission to an userview category

In the userview category that you wish to manage its permission via this plugin, edit the category's permission as shown in figure 5.

After setting up the Permission Menu, remember to configure all the respective userview categories.

Note that, multiple categories can use the same permission key. Setting up as such will grant multiple categories to a permission group.
