To (Specific email address)	Recipient fully qualified address.
To (Participant ID)	Participant ID(s) according to the process flow it resides in.  Multiple values can be accepted by separating them with semicolons. <div style="border: 1px solid gray; padding: 5px; margin-top: 10px;"> <p> When <b>To (Specific email address)</b> and <b>To (Participant ID)</b> are both populated, email will be sent to both.</p> </div>

CC	<p>Fully qualified address is expected.</p> <p>Multiple values can be accepted by separating them with semicolons.</p> <div style="border: 1px solid #ccc; padding: 5px; margin-top: 10px;"> <p> <b>CC:</b> lets you send a copy of a message to someone who's interested, but is not the primary recipient.</p> </div>
BCC	<p>Fully qualified address is expected.</p> <p>Multiple values can be accepted by separating them with semicolons.</p> <div style="border: 1px solid #ccc; padding: 5px; margin-top: 10px;"> <p> Both Cc and Bcc forward a copy of the message to everyone you've listed. The main difference between Cc or Carbon copy and Bcc (<b>Blind carbon copy</b>) is that, with the latter, the recipients do not get to know each other.</p> </div>
Subject	Email Subject.
Message	Email Message.
HTML Content?	Check if "Message" is intended to be a HTML content.
