## Introduction

Form Menu allows one to directly enter/view form data, without being part of a process flow.




Figure 1: Form UI Menu Properties

Name	Description
Label	The UI menu label.
Menu ID	Item link slug. Optional field.  Ensure that value defined here is <b>unique</b> to other UI menus in the app, since the <b>first matching/conflicting ID</b> will take precedence in page loading.
Form	Target form to load.

Show in Popup Dialog?	If checked, user will be presented in a popup dialog.
Readonly?	If checked, all the fields in the target form will be rendered as read-only.
Display Field as Label When Readonly?	Fields set to read-only will be rendered as label/text, instead of being shown in its original input element.
Add Edit Button In Form	Edit Button In Form
	Only appears when <b>Readonly</b> is checked.




Figure 2: Sample Form UI Menu in runtime




Figure 3: Redirection Properties

Action to Perform After Form Saved	Action to Perform After Form Saved.

	Parent Frame Top Window  Only appears when <b>Action to Perform After Form Saved</b> is set to Reload Window.

URL Redirect After Form Submission	URL Redirect After Form Submission.
	Only appears when <b>Action to Perform After Form Saved</b> is set to Redirection.
Redirect Target on Form Submission	Available options:
	Top Window
	Parent Window
	Current Window
	Only appears when <b>Action to Perform After Form Saved</b> is set to Redirection.
Field ID For URL Redirect Value Passover	Field ID from the preceding form to retrieve the value from.
	Only appears when <b>Action to Perform After Form Saved</b> is set to Redirection.
Field Value Passover Method	Available options:
	Append to URL
	As URL Request Parameter
	Only appears when <b>Action to Perform After Form Saved</b> is set to Redirection.
Request Parameter Name	Parameter name to hold the value retrieved via <b>"Field ID For URL Redirect Value Passover</b> " field specified above.
	Only appears when <b>Action to Perform After Form Saved</b> is set to Redirection.
Action to Perform on Cancel	Available options:
	Redirection
	Close Popup Dialog
URL Redirect on Cancellation	URL Redirect on Cancellation.
	When this value is set, the Cancel button will appear at the bottom of the form.
	Only appears when <b>Action to Perform on Cancel</b> is set to Redirection.
Redirect Target on Cancellation	Available options:
	Top Window
	Parent Window
	Current Window
	Only appears when <b>Action to Perform on Cancel</b> is set to Redirection.




Figure 4: UI Properties

Name	Description
Submit Button Label	Submit Button Label.
	Default Value: Save
Cancel Button Label	Cancel Button Label.  Default Value: Cancel  The Cancel button will only appear when "URL Redirect on Cancellation" field is configured.
Custom Header	Custom Header in HTML.
Custom Footer	Custom Footer in HTML.

Name	Description
UI Key Name	When set to point to a corresponding form field ID, the UI key value will be set into the particular field.
	See Ul Key for more info.
	(i) Example
	UI Key Value: sample
	UI Key Name: title




Figure 6: Sample UI key used in runtime

	See Figure 6.
Load Data Using UI Key?	When checked, record row will be loaded into the form using the UI key value.
	The "UI Key Name" field expects an "id" value, to facilitate record seeking using the primary key.





Figure 7: Cache Settings



Scope	Caching options are:	
	<ul> <li>None: No caching.</li> <li>Application: Cache content by application where all users will see the same content.</li> <li>User: Cache by username.</li> </ul>	
Duration (s)	Duration in seconds to cache content, defaults to 20 seconds if applicable.
